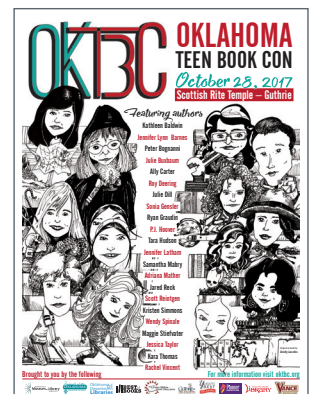


13,000+
